

#### **HOPE I'M IN THE FRAME BY NETALIE BRAUN** (2017)

56 minutes (Israel)

Winner of the 2017 Israeli Oscar for Best Documentary (under 60 minutes)

MICHAL BAT-ADAM is Israel's first woman film director who was for years the only one. "Hope I'm in the Frame" is a portrait of a filmmaker ahead of her time who challenged the nascent Israeli film industry's gender and ideological leanings. Her films raised acute questions about love, art, and responsibility and they highlighted subjects left untouched in Israeli cinema of the time: motherhood, female bonding, passion and anti-militarism. It's a story of a beautiful successful actress demanding a place on the other end of the camera and being subjected to scathing critique for it. A story of her childhood rejections intensified by her Sisyphean efforts to enter the canon of Israeli cinema. The film intimately enters her everyday life alongside her husband, the esteemed Israeli-French director Moshe Mizrahi. They share the struggle to carry on creating films despite aging and being shunned by the establishment. The film accompanies Michal's shooting of her latest film in which she contemplates the meanings of passing time.



# THE SHOW (2017) by GIANCARLO ESPOSITO, 104 MINUTES (USA)

Josh Duhamel, Famke Janssen, and Giancarlo Esposito highlight this pulse-pounding thriller about a reality show that exploits the on-camera deaths of its players — on live TV. After a dating show ends in violence, its host Adam Rogers (Duhamel) and a ratings-hungry network exec (Janssen) launch a terrifying new program that promises fresh kills every week. The tension mounts as a kindhearted janitor (Esposito) joins the deadly program, hoping to help his struggling family survive...at any cost.

Giancarlo Esposito is a celebrated film, television and stage actor, director and producer with a career spanning five decades.

Esposito can currently be seen in director Bong Joon-Ho's new sci-fi film Okja, alongside Jake Gyllenhaal, Tilda Swinton and Paul Dano. The film was premiered at the 2017 Cannes Film Festival to rave reviews. He recently wrapped production on Claude Lalonde's *The Gift*, opposite Sir Patrick Steward and Katie Holmes and on *The Death Cure*, the third film in 20th Century Fox's hit blockbuster action franchise *The Maze Runner*. The film is slated to be released on January 26, 2018. Esposito will star in the upcoming film, *Shriver*, alongside Whoopi Goldberg, Toni Collette and Thomas Haden Church, and will be seen James Franco's *The Long Home*, based on the William Gay novel of the same name.

Esposito is well known by television audiences for his iconic portrayal of drug kingpin Gustavo "Gus" Fring in AMC's acclaimed award-winning series *Breaking Bad*, for which he won the 2012 Critics Choice Award and earned a 2012 Emmy® nomination. He is now on the critically acclaimed prequel, *Better Call Saul*, which was nominated for an Emmy® Award. He is also in

Baz Luhrmann's Netflix series *The Get Down*, which looks at the birth of hip hop in New York in the 1970s

Under his production company, Quiet Hand Productions, Esposito directed *Gospel Hill*, winning over nine film festival awards. He co-starred with Danny Glover, Angela Bassett, Julia Stiles, Taylor Kitsch and Samuel L. Jackson. It was announced that Esposito will direct, produce & star as Frederick Douglass in the independent historical drama *Patriotic Treason* opposite Ed Harris, who will play abolitionist John Brown.

Esposito's most memorable performances can be seen in films such as Rabbit Hole, The Usual Suspects, Smoke, The Last Holiday and Spike Lee's films Do the Right Thing, Mo' Better Blues, School Daze and Malcolm X. Esposito's other film credits include The Jungle Book, Money Monster, Poker Night, I Alex Cross, SherryBaby, Ali, Nothing to Lose, Waiting to Exhale, Bob Roberts, King of New York and Cotton Club. In 1995, Esposito was nominated for an Independent Spirit Award for his work in Fresh. His other television credits include Revolution, Community, Once Upon a Time, Homicide: Life on The Streets, Law and Order, Bakersfield PD, Touched by an Angel, and Kidnapped.

Esposito won two Obie Awards for "Zooman and The Sign" at the Negro Ensemble Company and "Distant Fires" at The Atlantic Theatre Company, where he continues to perform and teach as a company member. His list of Broadway credits include productions of Sacrilege, Seesaw, Merrily We Roll Along, and Lost In The Stars. He also co-starred on Broadway with James Earl Jones, Terrence Howard and Phylicia Rashad in Debbie Allen's rendition of the great classic Tennessee Williams play, "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof."

#### CALIGARI is regarded as one of the greatest silent films of all time

At a carnival in Germany, Francis (Friedrich Feher) and his friend Alan (Rudolf Lettinger) encounter the crazed Dr. Caligari (Werner Krauss). The men see Caligari showing off his somnambulist, Cesare (Conrad Veidt), a hypnotized man who the doctor claims can see into the future. Shockingly, Cesare then predicts Alan's death, and by morning his chilling prophecy has come true—making Cesare the prime suspect. However, is Cesare guilty, or is the doctor controlling him?

As German film professor Anton Kaes wrote, "The style of German Expressionism allowed the filmmakers to experiment with filmic technology and special effects and to explore the twisted realm of repressed desires, unconscious fears, and deranged fixations"

Donald Sosin and Joanna Seaton are among the world's foremost silent film musicians, bringing their unique blend of keyboards, vocals and percussion to major film festivals—New York, Telluride, San Francisco, Seattle, Houston, TriBeCa, Denver—and to MoMA, BAM, MFA Boston, the Berlin Filmmuseum, and Moscow's Lumière Gallery. They are favorite guest artists at the National Gallery and at Italy's annual silent film retrospectives in Bologna and Pordenone. In 2015 they appeared at the film and music festival in Jecheon, South Korea. In 2016 Donald had orchestral

commissions for Chaplin and Keaton shorts from Brown University and Bologna's Cinema Ritrovato, and his score for the 1916 "Sherlock Holmes" was premiered in Odessa with 15,000 spectators. This fall sees the duo at Yale, at the University of Calgary, and the conference in Banff for the Victorian Preservation Society of North America. Joanna and Donald have also performed at Harvard, Brown and Emory Universities, and created scores for over 50 silent film DVDs on the Criterion, KinoLorber, Milestone and other labels

Donald has composition degrees from the University of Michigan and Columbia University, and Joanna has a Theatre Arts Degree from Cornell University.



DABKA BY BRYAN BUCKLEY (2017) 116 minutes (USA) Starring Al Pacino, Melanie Griffith, Evan Peters, and Barkhad Abdi

When rookie journalist Jay Bahadur (Evan Peters) has an inspiring chance encounter with his idol (Al Pacino), he uproots his life and moves to Somalia looking for the story of a lifetime. Hooking up with a local fixer (Barkhad Abdi), he attempts to embed himself with the local Somali pirates, only to find himself quickly in over his head. Based on the true story of one reporter's risk-taking adventure that ultimately brought the world an unprecedented first-person account of the pirates of Somalia.

Bryan Buckley's directing career started in 1994 when he directed the Emmy Award winning "This is Sports Center" Campaign. In 1997, Buckley co-found production company, Hungryman along with "This is SportsCenter" creator, Hank Perlman. Buckley has been dubbed the "King of the Super Bowl" by the New York Times. Directing over 50 commercials for the big game since 2000. Buckley wrote and directed the short film ASAD. The film was shot in Africa with an all Somali, refugee cast and screened at over 50 film festivals worldwide, taking top honors at the TriBeCa Film Festival and was nominated for an Academy Award in 2013. Buckleys first feature film, The Bronze, opened the 2015 Sundance Film Festival. The film stars Melissa Rauch as a foul-mouthed former gymnastics bronze medalist who must fight for her local celebrity status when a new young athlete's star rises in town The film made a splash in Park City as the breakout comedy of the festival.



#### STARLESS DREAMS by MEHRDAD OSKOUEL (2016),

76 minutes (Iran) documentary

WINNER 2017 BASSEL SHEHADE AWARD FOR SOCIAL JUSTICE

Mehrdad Oskouei, one of Iran's most prominent filmmakers, spent seven years securing access to a female juvenile rehabilitation and correctional facility on the outskirts of Tehran. The result is *Starless Dreams*, a haunting portrait of stolen childhood, and the stark testimonial of those previously ignored and invisible.

Starless Dreams plunges us into the lives of seven young teenage girls (Khatereh, Masoumeh, Ghazal, Somayeh, Nobody, Hasrat, and 651) sharing temporary quarters at the rehabilitation center. As the New Year approaches, the girls bond, and reveal—with playfully disarming honesty—the circumstances and acts that resulted in their incarceration. Masoumeh, along with her sister and mother, killed her abusive father. Nobody explains that she was arrested for "adultery, armed robbery, the brothel." 651 takes her name from the amount (measured in grams) of cocaine she was caught carrying. Outside the prison walls, danger is everywhere, even within their own families—virtually all of the girls have been "bothered" by male relatives.

Inside, the girls seek solace and comfort with each other and ponder the coming year. It is the sisterly bond that brings the girls to sing and dance with hope. It is also one that allows them to share tears.

Starless Dreams follows It's Always Late for Freedom (2008) and The Last Days of Winter (2011) in Oskouei's award-winning documentary trilogy which explores questions of crime and delinquency among Iranian youth. While Starless Dreams portrays the female experience in Iran's juvenile justice system, the first two installments focus on boys behind bars. [5 stars] "Brilliant."


America's wars in Iraq and Afghanistan have created a new population of American veterans: service members so severely disabled they would have died in previous wars, but who now survive because of advanced medical technology. We've figured out how to keep them alive and bring them back home, but what then? *AMERICAN VETERAN* is a feature length documentary portrait of one such soldier, Army Sergeant Nick Mendes. Nick was paralyzed from the neck down by a massive improvised explosive device in Afghanistan in 2011. Despite severe physical injuries and PTSD, Nick's mind is clear and his spirit and sense of humor are very much intact.

#### **HOTEL SALVATION by SHUBHASHISH BHUTIANI**

(2016) 102 minutes (India)

In this delightful, thoughtful, and sensitive film an ominous dream convinces 77-year-old Dayanand Kumar that his end could be near. He takes the news to his son Rajiv, knowing he wants to breathe his last in the holy city of Varanasi and end the cycle of rebirth, by attaining salvation. Being the dutiful son he is, Rajiv, is left with no choice but to drop everything and make the journey with his stubborn father. Daya and Rajiv check into Mukti Bhawan (Hotel Salvation) in Varanasi, a guesthouse devoted to people to die there. But as the days go by, Rajiv struggles to juggle his responsibilities back home, while Daya starts to bloom in the hotel. Rajiv gives his father a shot at salvation but as family bonds are tested, he finds himself torn, not knowing what he must do to keep his life together.

In sharp contrast, these early years were also plagued with debilitating medical issues that ceaselessly attacked his mind and body. Many of the film's images are inspired from Vreeland's dreams, where actuality has no bearing, pain is personified, and nature holds an all-powerful presence.

#### OSIRIS by KATHRYN FERENTCHAK, 30 minutes

In a world decimated by nuclear fallout, a community's survival hinges on its wind-powered radiation shield. Cesium storm clouds gather on the horizon just as the wind farm breaks down. With only days to start the system, Natasha, the hardened young engineer with the fate of their world on her shoulders, must learn to work with her tech-genius brother, Lysander.

#### **DAN SILVER**

In June, 2017 Dan was named VP, Head of Platforms & Content/ New Media for Marvel Entertainment where he oversees all of Marvel's digital platforms as well as their New

Media and Non-Fiction content. Previously, Dan was an Executive Producer for ABC News Digital overseeing ABC News' digital editorial team. He helped shepherd various new content initiatives to evolve storytelling formats across all digital properties. He established the digital short documentary brand ABC News Features, including titles *Mercy* and *Steps into a High Calm* as well as the *Dead Horse Bay*, the Emmy award winning piece that marked ABC News Digital's first-ever nomination and win in 2016. Under Silver's leadership, *ABCNews.com* received the prestigious Edward R. Morrow award for 'Best Website' in 2016. He has also extended ABC News' creative footprint within the larger Walt Disney Company through collaborations with Marvel on the award-winning non-fiction digital comic Madaya Mom, and The Walt Disney Studios on the digital short series *Young & Gifted*.

Prior to ABC News, Silver was the Senior Director of Development at ESPN Films, where he was a multi Emmy-award winning producer. Silver was integral to the critically acclaimed documentary series 30 for 30, where he oversaw the development and production of The Two Escobars, Winning Time: Reggie Miller vs. The New York Knicks, Once Brothers, Silly Little Game, and The Hawaiian. 





Engravings in the genre of *World Upside Down*, known since the 16th century, depict such scenes as a pig gutting the butcher, a child punishing his teacher, a man carrying a donkey on his back, man and woman exchanging roles and dress, and a beggar in rags magnanimously bestowing alms on a rich man. These engravings contain demons, chimeras, fish flying through the sky and the death itself.

In AES+F interpretation, the absurdist scenes from the medieval carnival appear as episodes of contemporary life in a multichannel video installation (presented at the ISFF as one channel screening). Characters act out scenes of these social utopias and exchange masks, morphing from beggars to rich people, from police to thieves. Metrosexual street-cleaners are showering the city, female inquisitors torture men on IKEA-style structures. Children and seniors are fighting in a kickboxing match. *Inverso Mundus* is a world where chimeras are pets and the Apocalypse is entertaining.

The title of the work, Inverso – which in Italian means simultaneously "reverse" or "opposite" and in old Italian it means "poetry." The word *Mundus* comes from the Latin "world."

Edward S. Greene was the first Board Chair of a fledgling arts organization: the Syracuse International Film & Video Festival. With generosity and enthusiasm, Eddie (as he always told us to call him) guided the shape of the festival's mission, and helped structure the organization into what is now: the fourteenth annual **Syracuse International Film Festival**.

With friendship and wisdom, Eddie mentored the festivals' co-founders, Owen and Christine Shapiro, for the first three festival years. During this time, he guided them on the development of a non-profit organization and advised them on all aspects of non-profit organizational management. He connected on behalf of the festival with Syracuse University chancellors and leaders of community organizations. Eddie completely supported the idea and goal of shaping the town/gown relationship the Shapiros had envisioned.

Eddie grew up in Syracuse, attended Nottingham High School and Syracuse University, married his sweetheart Joan Feder and went on to build a life, a family, and a highly successful career that combined devotion to his family, the law, and his community. Looking around Syracuse, the name of Edward S. Green appears on the rosters of the many charitable, civic, educational, theatrical and arts organizations in the city. During his professional career

he served on the boards, and usually and often as chair, of the Syracuse Symphony, the Syracuse Jewish Federation, Everson Museum, Syracuse Stage, and often as chair of the Syracuse Symphony, the Gifford Foundation, the Interreligious Council, the West Side Initiative, the Syracuse International Film Festival, Glimmerglass Opera, and the Community Foundation. Eddie was also a trustee at Syracuse University for many years, and served on committees under four separate Chancellors. And he managed all this volunteer involvement while also spending countless amounts of time with his family on camping and skiing trips, traveling around the world with family and friends, and building a life full of happy memories with family and colleagues.

As Syracuse International Film Festival Board Chair, he always asked: "OK – so how can we make this work?" Eddie always thought big and encouraged us to think outside the box. The Syracuse International Film Festival and Syracuse itself have benefited from Eddie's vision.

Edward S. Green, born in Syracuse on September 3, 1927, passed away peacefully in his sleep on March 2, 2017.
